GREENER, LEANER, LANDFILLS

Two and one-half years ago, the District's refuse hauler, CR&R proposed changing from the current practice to automated trash pickup. The issue was discussed at two RCSD Board Meetings in February and March of 2007, at which time the public asked questions about the need for the change, separation of trash, size and numbers of containers, etc; the proposal was tabled.

The County of Orange is now reintroducing the proposed change to automated pickup. In order to give the public an opportunity to be heard on this matter, a public hearing will be held at the October 13th Board meeting to explain the reasoning behind and necessity for the change. We are told that Rossmoor is the only area in the County that is not using an automated pickup system.

Primarily, counties throughout the state are required to reduce the waste stream to landfills by 50%. In order to meet this goal, separation of trash is mandatory. Currently Rossmoor trash is not separated at the residence; this process is done manually at CR&R's facility. This current procedure is an acceptable form of recycling and will not change.

Factors driving this change are many. Cost is certainly a primary consideration. Automated pickup only requires one employee per truck instead of two. Workers Compensation costs are dramatically reduced when lifting of heavy trash containers is eliminated.

Rossmoor and/or traffic With the reduction in costs to the trash hauler, it would seem appropriate that some of the savings would be returned to the resident in the form of a rate reduction. This potential alone is a good reason to attend the Public Hearing and let the County know your thoughts and concerns. Sample trash bins will be available for viewing.

From Henry's Desk



As Summer fades into Autumn, many changes are in the air. While many of our neighboring communities are struggling with their finances, the District maintains its financial strength, in spite of property tax takeaways by the State. This is allowing the District to take on several capital projects; including the remodeling of the Rossmoor Park Community Center and replacing the roof on the Rush Park Auditorium.

As to changes in the community, there will be a **PUBLIC HEARING** at the **OCTOBER 13 MEETING** of the **RCSD BOARD OF DIRECTORS**. The County will be discussing a proposal to automate trash pickup, a change that has been previously suggested and rejected. It now seems that it is no longer a question of if, but when. Residents who have opinions on this subject should attend the hearing or send your comments to the RCSD email address: **rcsd@rossmoor-csd.org**.

Another change is in our use and conservation of water. The community's provider of water, Golden State Water Co. is being required by the Metropolitan Water District to reduce water usage by 8%. Failure on the part of individual residents or the District to make this reduction will likely result in ever increasing water usage rates and charges. The District has begun its efforts by installing "smart timers" which regulate irrigation at our parks based on weather data to only water as actually needed for maintenance of the land-scape. Also an important element of the remodeling of the Community Center is the installation of waterless urinals which will save approximately 40,000 gallons of water every year.

Each of us needs to do our part if we are to survive the drought. Just turning off your sink faucet while brushing your teeth will save countless gallons of water per household.

We have recently utilized our contractor's services to inventory the districts tree population, condition, and vacancies .We intend to utilize this information to develop a plan to maintain and revitalize your urban forest. **WE NEED YOUR HELP!**

- Parkway trees are planted by our contractor, West Coast Arborists, and are initially watered by them. But we need you, the resident, to help us keep our new young trees healthy.
- Please DO NOT remove the stakes supporting the tree. They will be removed when the tree is strong enough to stand on its own.
- Please DO NOT use a weed trimmer or allow your Gardner to use one around the base of the tree. It will damage or kill the tree. You could be held responsible for the cost of replacement.
- Please *DO* Water your new tree. Like us they can't survive without water. The more water, the better for a healthy strong fast-growing tree.

We are currently planting trees district wide. If you wish to have a tree planted in the Spring, let us know. For information Call RCSD @ (562) 430- 3707

Holiday Recipe

Appetit

PUMPKIN MARBLE CHEESECAKE

- 1 1/2 cup Gingersnap Crumbs
- 1/2 cup Finely Chopped Pecans
- 1/3 cup Margarine, Melted
- 16 oz. Cream Cheese, Softened
- 3/4 cup Sugar
- 1 tsp Vanilla
- 3 Eggs
- 1 cup Canned Pumpkin
- 3/4 tsp. Cinnamon

Combine crumbs, pecans and margarine; press onto bottom and 1 1/2 inches up sides of 9-inch springform pan Bake at 350F for 10 minutes. Combine cream cheese, 1/2 c sugar and vanilla, mixing at medium speed on electric mixer until well blended. Add eggs, one at a time, mixing well after each addition. Reserve 1 c batter, chill. Add remaining sugar, pumpkin and spices to remaining batter; mix well. Alternately layer pumpkin and cream cheese batters over crust. Cut through batters with knife several times for marble effect. Bake at 350F for 55 minutes. Loosen cake from rim of pan; cool before removing rim of pan. Chill.

TREE TRIMMING

Our contractor West Coast Arborists is currently trimming the trees in district 3 as part of the annual 4 year trim cycle. In addition to the annual trimming, we provide safety trims as needed. If you feel your tree needs attention call RCSD @ (562) 430-3707 and we will evaluate the tree to see if it meets the criteria for such a trim.
