What is the RCSD doing to get greener? Well, you're looking at one solution. All residents are offered the option of receiving the RCSD News electronically and many have chosen e-mail over snail mail—a wise choice. The e-version of our newsletter is more vibrant and colorful with integrated links that easily direct you to our website and other services. We take our carbon footprint seriously. Our web host is powered by 100% wind energy. We've expanded the functionality of our website and plan even more improvements in the near future. We've enhanced the level and frequency of electronic communications to those on our electronic mailing list. Here are some more steps we've taken to be greener:

- Offer our parks & facilities applications on our website.
- Have migrated to an electronic filing system with shared drives for interoffice access to unsecured materials.
- Re-use office materials whenever possible.
- Think before we print & recycle paper
- Purchase supplies locally whenever possible.
- Installed waterless urinals at Rossmoor Park.
- Installed irrigation smart timers.
- Plan to install solar panels at Rush Park.
- Design and print most of our brochures and advertising materials in-house, using a environmentally-friendly printer which utilizes solid ink technology.

Urban Forests actually extend the life of paved surfaces. The asphalt paving on streets contains stone aggregate in an oil binder. Without tree shade, the oil heats up and volatizes, leaving the aggregate unprotected. Vehicles loosen the aggregate; prematurely grinding down the pavement.

From Henry's Desk



The thing that makes Rossmoor unique is that it is Rossmoor and not something else. Recently, however, the City of Los Alamitos approved a series of City Council and Staff Goals, many of which focused upon, or could have an effect on, Rossmoor. These included amending their General Plan which would lay out the land use elements for **1) Annexation of the southwest corner of Katella Avenue and Los Alamitos Blvd (Rossmoor Village), 2) Potential annexation of the Rossmoor area, 3) Providing municipal services to Rossmoor, reimbursed by the County, and 4) Re-establishment of the Los Alamitos Redevelopment Agency.** The first three initiatives are clearly directed at Rossmoor. The latter, is a necessary element for redeveloping the entire intersection of Katella Ave. and Los Alamitos Blvd. should Rossmoor Village be acquired.

These matters are only being brought to your attention so that you are aware of the potential for dramatic changes to the Rossmoor community. The RCSD has taken no official position on these developments, but the Board of Directors has established an Ad Committee composed of two RCSD members, two RHA members and two members of the community at large. The role of the committee is still being defined, but initially, it will monitor agendas and meetings of the Los Alamitos Planning Commission and City Council, Local Area Formation Commission (LAFCO), as well as, maintain a dialogue with Orange County officials.

As more becomes known, the Rossmoor community will be kept informed of developments which could affect our residents. Thus far, there has been no formal communication from Los Alamitos as to Rossmoor or its actual intentions. Until these are more fully understood, the District will reserve judgment on their merits.

In November, a status report on Rossmoor's urban forest was presented to the **RCSD Board of Directors**. The Board then scheduled a Workshop for their February meeting. The purpose of the [Workshop](#) was to obtain community input on the recommendations proposed by me and by staff to update the District's policy on matters such as tree removal, tree planting specifications, approved tree species, uniformity of tree species by block, tree trimming methods and schedules, hardscape limitations on parkways, and coordination with Orange County on tree root pruning/removal for replacement of curbs, sidewalks and gutters.

Perhaps the most important information provided during both sessions was the depiction of the total inventory of trees in Rossmoor with a [chart](#) breaking out diseased/declining and poorly structured/declining trees which likely will need to be removed in the not too distant future. **Clearly, about 20% of the District's 5,438 trees are reaching the end of their useful life.** This presents a challenge to maintain these trees as long as possible and to plan for replacement of a larger than usual number of trees in the coming years. The Board will discuss these matters and consider policy changes at their [April 13th Board meeting](#). I hope to see you there.


